

Authorship and Contributorship Policy

BYLINE AUTHORS

Policy

Individuals designated as byline authors (authors appearing in the byline of the manuscript) must meet ALL of the following criteria: 1) substantial contributions to study conception and design, acquisition of data, or analysis and interpretation of data; 2) drafting the article or revising it critically for important intellectual content; 3) final approval of the version to be published; and 4) agreement to be accountable for all aspects of the work in ensuring that questions related to the accuracy or integrity of any part of the work are appropriately investigated and resolved.

Acquisition of funding, acquisition of data, or general supervision of the research group alone does not constitute authorship.

All individuals who meet all of the above criteria must be listed as byline authors.

Procedures

Upon manuscript acceptance, each author must sign an authorship statement that appears on the Authorship Form, as follows:

Authorship Statement. I certify that I meet all of the following criteria for authorship: 1) substantial contributions to study conception and design, acquisition of data, or analysis and interpretation of data; 2) drafting the article or revising it critically for important intellectual content; 3) final approval of the version to be published; and 4) agreement to be accountable for all aspects of the work in ensuring that questions related to the accuracy or integrity of any part of the work are appropriately investigated and resolved.

NON-AUTHOR CONTRIBUTORS

Policy

All individuals or organizations that have made substantial contributions to the manuscript but do not meet the criteria for authorship must be identified in an Acknowledgments section along with their specific contributions. Examples of “substantial contributions” include assistance with study design, data acquisition, data analysis, or manuscript preparation, including writing or editing assistance. If this assistance was supported financially, the entity that provided such financial support must be stated, along with any potential conflicts of interest.

The *IJM*SC recognizes that individual medical writers and editors, as well as companies that provide medical writing and editing services, can be legitimate contributors to a manuscript. Involvement of such contributors does not affect the manuscript’s chances of acceptance, provided that all such assistance is appropriately acknowledged, including source of funding for the assistance and any potential conflicts of interest of the involved contributors.

The corresponding or submitting author is responsible for ensuring that all substantial contributions by non-authors are included in the Acknowledgments section and that all such non-authors agree to such inclusion.

Procedures

As part of the electronic submission process, the submitting author must check one of the following boxes:

- o **Yes**, individuals or organizations other than the byline authors have made substantial contributions to the manuscript, such as assistance with study design, data acquisition, data analysis, or manuscript preparation, including writing or editing assistance. These individuals or organizations are listed in the Acknowledgments section with their specific contributions, their funding status, and any potential conflicts of interest, and they have agreed to be so listed.

- o **No**, no individuals or organizations other than the byline authors have made substantial contributions to the manuscript.
