

## Instructions to Authors: Manuscript Descriptions

*The Journal of Health and Pollution* is an online journal of peer-reviewed scientific research and news published quarterly by Pure Earth. Its mission is to facilitate a discussion of toxic pollution and its impacts to human health, focusing on low- and middle-income countries.

The editors welcome manuscripts based on original research, as well as findings from re-interpretation and examination of existing data.

*JH&P* focuses on point-source pollution, related health impacts, environmental control and remediation technology.

*JH&P* is published in English and all manuscripts must be submitted in this language. Our editors are willing to work closely and extensively with authors for whom English is a foreign language in order to bring the writing in accepted manuscripts to a state of publication readiness.

*JH&P* does not publish on the following topics:

- Greenhouse gases or climate change impacts, adaptation or vulnerability;
- Biological or chemical oxygen demand (unless it relates directly to human health);
- Pollution which has no potential human health impact, or for which there is no pathway to humans.
