Gold Foil Operators Guests at "Gold Clinic"

On Thursday morning, October 22, 1981, the clinical program will be held at the College of Dentistry on the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center Campus. On this campus, some 3,000 students are enrolled in more than 50 degree programs of the seven colleges — Dentistry, Allied Health, Public Health, Medicine, Nursing, Pharmacy and Graduate.

The College of Dentistry began in 1972 with a class of 24 students. The College moved into its new building in 1976. This five story structure provides teaching, research, continuing education and office facilities. Each of the five clover shaped clinics, which give the building its unique shape, contain 36 operatories where students provide patient treatment under faculty supervision. Each clinic is color coordinated as to "Blue Clinic", "Green Clinic", "Burgundy Clinic", etc. The American Academy of Gold Foil Operators will be operating in the "Gold Clinic" which just goes to show what a fantastic local arrangements committee can do when they are intimidated by Harold Schnepper and Ralph Boelsche.
