CERTIFICATION IN OPERATIVE DENTISTRY

On February 12, 1986 in Chicago at the annual meeting of the Academy of Operative Dentistry, the American Board of Operative Dentistry received into membership Dr. Patrick J. Haney (Albuquerque, New Mexico), Dr. Robert C. Keene (Hanover, New Hampshire), and Dr. Maurice J. Logan (Hanover, New Hampshire) and presented them with a Certificate of Proficiency in Operative Dentistry. This distinction was earned by the recipients following a two-year long examination process involving three phases: a written examination, an oral examination based upon the submission of cases for which restorative services were provided, and a clinical examination which required the performance of clinical procedures during a concentrated three-day session. This Certification Program, which designates the successful candidates as Board Certified in Operative Dentistry, is sponsored by the Academy of Operative Dentistry, an organization devoted to the promotion of excellence in the practice, education and research in operative dentistry.

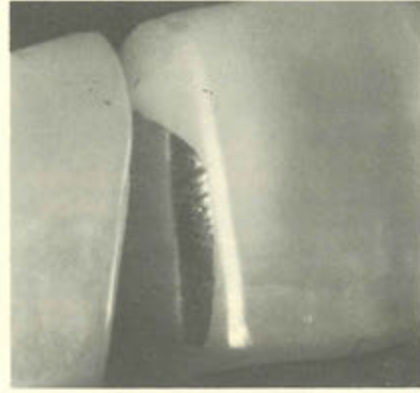

SECOND DIRECT GOLD COURSE

The second Direct Gold course sponsored by the AAFGO, Operative Academy, Williams Gold, Hygenic, Suter and American Dental was held in Indianapolis June 17-20, 1986. The nine participants were Drs. Fred Eichmiller — Minnesota; Giancarlo Gallo — Italy; Joel Martin — New Jersey; Jeff Morrison — Maryland; Gonzalo Pardo — Stonybrook; Norman Schutt — Air Force; William Sylvia — Tufts; James Timmons — Kentucky; and Tim Toepke — Illinois. The instructors were Drs. Mel Lund, Bill Brackett, Tim Carlson and Mike Cochran from Indiana and Julian Thomas from Northwestern.

The general enthusiasm shown by all concerned indicates that it was very successful. There were lectures, laboratory exercises and,

most important, clinical sessions on Thursday and Friday. All restorations were successful, with the preparations and finished restorations viewed by the other participants and the instructors. An interesting experience was the use of a binocular microscope to evaluate condensation and finishing procedures during the laboratory exercises.

The committee will discuss the scheduling of the next course during the Foil Academy meeting in October. It appears that June is the best time for most of those interested in taking the course as well as the instructors.

CHANGES IN BY-LAWS

To Be Considered and Voted on at Business Meeting, October 17, 1986

Change p. 12 — Chap. VI Committees

In Section 1, add "JOURNAL" between "NOMINATING" and "NECROLOGY".

Section 7 — p. 4 — after "a", add "(SEE SECTION 9)".

New Section 9 — p. 14 (Change NECROLOGY to Sect. 10):

Matters pertaining to the Journal "Operative Dentistry" shall be governed by a Corporation and Board of Directors consisting of an equal number of members from this Academy, and the Academy of Operative Dentistry.

a. Corporation — Academy representation shall consist of 8 members from the Academy, i.e. the Executive Council. In the event the Academy should be dissolved, membership of the 8 members in the corporation shall terminate.

b. Board of Directors — two members of the Academy shall be designated by the 8 corporation members to serve on the Board of Directors of Operative Dentistry. The term of a director shall be three years, with an overlap of at least one year for each director.

c. In accordance with the By-Laws of Operative Dentistry, the editor shall serve as chairman of the Board of Directors. The editor shall be selected, and may be removed from office by a majority vote of the membership of the Corporation at a meeting called for that purpose.
